Eligibility Note

Refugees under Canada's Immigration and Refugee Protection Act who have been given 'Refugee Status', and issued a 'Notice of Decision' (Decision on Refugee Protection Claim) and have a valid Canadian work permit will be eligible to participate in Skill Up program.

Eligibility Requirements

All eligible program participants to:

- Be interested in a career in the Construction/ Trades sector in Alberta
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Have Canadian Language Benchmark Level (CLB) 5+
- Be a Permanent Resident (PR status) or Canadian citizen—that's been in Canada less than 10 years
- Be legally entitled to work in Canada
